Chairman Zimmer called the September 11, 2013 meeting of the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) to order at 10:10 a.m. and thanked everyone for their attendance. Chairman Zimmer asked the Commission to observe a moment of silence in memory of the events of September 11, 2001. The first order of business was to review the Minutes from the June 12, 2013 Meeting. *A motion to approve the minutes as submitted was made by Commissioner Damiani. Commissioner Darr seconded the motion and the minutes were approved by unanimous vote.*

The next item on the agenda was the Chairman's Report. Chairman Zimmer thanked Derin Myers for his extraordinary work since January filling two positions at PCCD. Mr. Myers was appointed as the interim Director of the Office of Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) after Mike Pennington left, in addition to his regular duties as Director of Administration. Commissioner Sharp thanked Mr. Myers on behalf of the Juvenile Justice Delinquency Prevention Committee (JJJPC). On August 12, 2013 John Frain became the new Director of OJJDP. Chairman Zimmer noted that one of the great things Mr. Frain brings to the position is a wide range of disciplines including a keen understanding of the juvenile justice, child welfare and behavioral health systems.

Chairman Zimmer noted that Lee Ann Labecki left PCCD in July and accepted a position with KPMG Consulting to oversee automation efforts for the Department of Public Welfare, Office of Children, Youth and Families' Child Welfare System. Efforts are currently underway to fill Ms. Labecki's position.

On September 25, 2013 the Multidisciplinary Investigative Team (MDIT)/Child Advocacy Centers (CAC) Conference will be held in State College in conjunction with Penn State's Second Annual Conference on Child Maltreatment. The conference will be cosponsored by the Department of Public Welfare (DPW), Penn State University and PCCD and will focus on training district attorneys, county children and youth administrators and law enforcement representatives on the MDIT and CAC requirements. This conference is the result of a specific recommendation from the Task Force on Child Protection Report. A model set of standards for MDITs will be presented at the conference to guide counties in their investigative protocols in order to provide high quality investigations and interventions for every child victim. Finally, a grant program that was achieved through a partnership with DPW and PCCD will be announced to support the development of MDITs or training and resources for existing MDITs. Secretary Mackereth has a Children's Justice Act Subcommittee in place, as mandated by federal law, which is composed of Pennsylvania's best child maltreatment experts from both the justice and child welfare systems.

Next, Chairman Zimmer gave an update on the 2013 JAG process. For the past two years the JAG process has been competitive, and PCCD has actively engaged its advisory committees in determining the objectives and strategies that should be included in the funding announcement. Due to ongoing funding cuts, only \$2.8 million will be available for local JAG projects in 2013. The chairs of the advisory committees have been struggling to figure out how to distribute this lesser amount of money across the Commonwealth. The possibility of reconsidering the worthy applications that were not funded in 2012 was recently discussed. Staff is vetting that possibility to see if it is a viable plan. The Committee of Chairs will continue to meet and will have a plan for the Commission to vote on at the December meeting.

Chairman Zimmer said there was a shooting at the Ross Township Municipal Building in Monroe County in August. Three people were killed and five injured. Chairman Zimmer thanked the Office of Victims' Services (OVS) for responding so quickly and supporting the Monroe County Victims Services.

Finally, Chairman Zimmer noted that the Victims Compensation Assistance Program (VCAP) processing time is down by 14.1% since January. The backlog of claims is currently at 500, which reflects a 19.74% decrease since the beginning of the year.

Next on the agenda was the Executive Director's Report. Linda Rosenberg planned to offer a federal funding update, but the numbers are in such constant fluctuation that it is difficult, if not impossible, to present a snapshot of the situation. Congress is considering passing a continuing resolution until mid-December at the current funding levels. The National Criminal Justice Association (NCJA) has done a good job of educating Congress about the importance of these funds.

The Office of Criminal Justice System Improvements (OCJSI) recently won two competitive grant awards. The first award is for the Mid-Atlantic Regional Information Sharing Consortium in which Delaware, Maryland, Washington, D.C. and Pennsylvania share arrest, probation and parole information. The \$353,000 grant will provide funding to build the technology so a JNET user will be able to query the other systems. The second award, which is for \$359,000, will help implement Sex Offender Registration and Notification Act (SORNA) by supporting technology improvements for state police, the Department of Corrections (DOC) and the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole (PBPP).

There are several upcoming funding announcements. The first is a partnership between DPW and PCCD, including grant money received from the Staunton Farms Foundation which will be for specialized behavioral health training for law enforcement. The second funding announcement will be for a contractor to administer the Pennsylvania Mental Health and Justice Center of Excellence. The final funding announcement will be for the \$265,000 in formula Coverdell dollars targeted to improve quality, timeliness and credibility of forensic science services.

Ms. Rosenberg discussed PCCD's efforts to encourage collaborative planning boards at the local level. These boards help with decision making and implementation of system-wide efforts. Several successful collaboratives have been built in multiple areas and PCCD is working to provide more data to them including the rollout of the CJAB dashboards. PCCD is also working with Penn State to do an analysis of the collaborative planning boards in Philadelphia, Elk, Erie, Schuylkill, Blair and Allegheny Counties. The goal of the analysis is to determine characteristics of effective coalitions and planning boards, the key components of inter-coalition networks, how the entities function and sustain themselves, and the benefits, outcomes and issues arising out of planning entities. Ms. Rosenberg asked the office directors to give a high-level overview of the planning boards in their areas. Bob Merwine, Director of OCJSI, discussed Criminal Justice Advisory Boards (CJABs), Re-Entry Coalition Boards and Cross-Systems Mapping Teams/Sequential Intercept Model Teams. Kathy Buckley from OVS discussed STOP Violence Against Women Coordinating Teams and Local Policy Boards. Mr. Frain, Director of OJJDP, discussed Communities That Care (CTC) Boards and Local Juvenile Justice System Enhancement Strategy (JJSES) Planning Groups.

Commissioner King asked if there was any annual increase in the number of school districts engaged in the PAYS survey. Ms. Rosenberg said historically the biggest gaps were Philadelphia and Allegheny Counties, and Kelley Hodge, the Director of the Safe School Advocate's Office, has been working hard to get the Philadelphia School District to participate in the survey.

Finally, Ms. Rosenberg noted several upcoming conferences with PCCD involvement. On October 28-30, PCCD's 2013 CJAB Conference, "One System, Many Pieces," will be held in State College. The 2013 Pennsylvania Conference on Juvenile Justice, sponsored by the Juvenile Court Judges' Commission (JCJC), the Pennsylvania Council of Chief Juvenile Probation Officers and PCCD, will be held November 6-8 at the Harrisburg Hilton. The 2013 Center for Safe Schools' Safe Schools Conference, "Keeping Our Children Safe: Strategies for Schools and Communities," will be held in Grantville on October 1-2.

The next item on the agenda was the Victims' Services Advisory Committee (VSAC) Report. In accordance with the Commission's conflict of interest policy, Commissioner Delaney yielded the floor to Commissioner Lavery for presentation and recommendation of the first action item. The Commission was requested to take action on the approval of six initial applications not to exceed \$929,957 in 2012 Single Solicitation Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds. Staff and VSAC recommended approval of the applications. *Commissioner Lavery made a motion to approve the grant applications and Commissioner Zottola seconded the motion.*

Commissioner Fitzgerald asked if an evaluation study is premature as Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) is still in a developmental stage. Commissioner Bergstrom responded that the programs and counties that will be evaluated are more established. There will be many benefits to doing this study in Pennsylvania instead of relying on studies from other states, and because there are efforts underway to expand training in this area it will be beneficial to find out sooner rather than later if it is effective. The study will look at process issues as well as outcomes. Ms. Rosenberg added that efforts were made to ensure large, medium and small counties would be included in the sample. Commissioner Zottola noted that the results of this study will be beneficial to the Center of Excellence which will be charged with overseeing CIT in Pennsylvania. Commissioner Vulakovich asked how folks with autism are handled by CIT. Commissioner Zottola responded that the Mental Health and Justice Advisory Committee (MHJAC) adopted intellectual disabilities as one of its priorities.
