- Chairman Graybill announced that Theodore Johnson has taken the Chairman position of the Board of Probation and Parole, but was unable to attend the meeting or send representation.

Executive Director MacLaughlin

- Executive Director MacLaughlin stated that the Curriculum Committee was able to run a Train-The-Trainer for a Course 3 on March 12th, and used students from Cumberland and Dauphin county to run the new Course 3.
- Executive Director MacLaughlin stated the Curriculum Committee wants to run another pilot course for the new Course 3 due to them running out of time to complete all the drills. Possibly having to modify the course again.
- Commissioner Libby suggested the possibility of lowering the amount of students to attend the course and see if the course can be completed on time.
- Executive Director MacLaughlin announced that FETC has been approved by the
 Governors Office saying FETC can have a YouTube channel. The channel would feature
 training videos to make sure all of the instructors are on the same page state wide. It
 could be an easy way to get certain demonstrations across the state for everybody to
 view.
