The School Safety and Security Committee (SSSC) of the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) announces the availability of Federal COVID Relief – ARPA – School Mental Health Grants funding to support the behavioral health needs of students within this Commonwealth.

This noncompetitive funding announcement is specifically for School Districts, Intermediate Units, Area Career and Technical Schools, Charter Schools, Regional Charter Schools, and Cyber Charter Schools to support mental health initiatives. A total of \$90 million is being announced to support this initiative. Allocation amounts per eligible school entity are included in Appendix A of the solicitation.

- **Due Date** – Applications must be submitted electronically through PCCD’s Egrants system no later than 11:59 PM on February 29, 2024
- **Technical Assistance** – Grant application and administrative guides can be accessed on [PCCD’s website](#) under the Funding section. Applicants are strongly encouraged to review the application and administrative guides before calling the Egrants Help Desk for assistance. - **Egrants Submission** – An application submitted in Egrants by the deadline is not considered complete until PCCD has received the executed signature page, as well as any other required documents.
- **Administrative Rejection** – An application that does not meet all the listed requirements in this noncompetitive funding announcement may be administratively rejected. If necessary, PCCD staff will contact school entities whose applications do not meet all the listed requirements in this funding announcement.
- **Corrections** – If PCCD returns an application for corrections, the final application (including all corrections and required documents) must be returned to and approved by PCCD for the requested funding to be awarded.
- **Non-supplantation** – Funding must not be used to supplant/replace state, federal, or local funds that would otherwise be available to provide for program-related services. PCCD funding is to be used in addition to other funds that are made available for services.
- **Keywords** – Applicants are required to select “Keywords” from the dropdown menu located on the Main Summary screen in Egrants. The required keywords are below. Applicants may also select other keywords that apply specifically to their application.

Funding Announcement Title: 2023-24 School Mental Health Grants

1. Overview:

The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) is now accepting applications for the 2023-24 School Mental Health Grants solicitation, which is a noncompetitive, formula-based funding announcement to provide grants to eligible school entities to support mental health initiatives.

NOTE: This noncompetitive, formula-based solicitation is specifically for school entities as defined under [24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B](#) of the PA Public School Code (i.e., a school district, area career and technical school, intermediate unit, charter school, regional charter school, and cyber charter school). The objective of the 2023-24 School Mental Health Grants solicitation is to ensure that eligible school entities meet 'Level 1' of the revised [Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria Standards](#) (adopted by the SSSC, May 2023). The Baseline Criteria are standards that assist school entities in guiding their decisions about their behavioral health and physical security needs. Developed with input by experts across Pennsylvania, the Baseline Criteria organize policies, programs, activities, equipment, and trainings into a multi-leveled chart from Level 1, which are the most basic elements a school entity should have, to Level 3, which are the most advanced elements. A priority focus of the SSSC is to ensure that all school entities, at a minimum, meet a basic, Level 1 standard of safety for students and staff.

School entities are strongly encouraged to review the [Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria](#) in advance of submitting your grant application under this solicitation to determine what criteria your school entity currently meets and where additional investments may be needed. Level 1 criteria must be satisfied prior to school entities utilizing these resources for other Eligible Program Activities and Expenses.

Additional PCCD Grant Opportunities Related to School Safety

Note: This funding announcement is part of a broader package of funding opportunities recently announced by PCCD related to school safety and security and school mental health. Eligible applicants are strongly urged to carefully review all available funding announcements and determine which opportunity may be best suited for their specific school entity and/or project needs based on eligibility criteria, funding priorities and requirements, and other factors. School entities are eligible to submit multiple applications for funding, as eligible; however, the proposals should not be duplicative and must fund separate and unique activities. Please note that PCCD staff will cross-reference applications with all submitted applications that may be submitted during the January 2024 school safety funding rounds. Please see PCCD's [Active Funding Announcements](#) webpage for more information regarding these solicitations.

2. Funding Availability:

A total of \$90 million in Federal COVID Relief – ARPA – School Mental Health Grant funding provided by the state budget and allocated through [24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B](#) is available for this solicitation.

Funding is based on the formula included in 24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B, which stipulates school districts are to receive a \$100,000 base amount for their mental health grant, and an additional amount based on their 2021-22 Adjusted Average Daily Membership (AADM). All other eligible school entities (i.e., intermediate units, area career and technical centers, charter schools, regional charter schools, and cyber charter schools) are to receive \$70,000 for mental health activities.

PCCD expects to fund 778 grants with budgets not to exceed the funding allocations as detailed in Appendix A.

Award letters will be available in Egrants as soon as possible after the applications are approved.

PCCD is not liable for costs incurred prior to the official start date of the award.

3. Project Dates:

As these are noncompetitive funds, applications will be approved by PCCD staff as they meet the criteria of this solicitation for 24-month projects and will have a start date of January 1, 2024 and an end date of December 31, 2025. Actual project dates may vary dependent upon timeliness of the application submitted, the length of PCCD staff review, and the responsiveness of the applicant to staff inquiries; however, all projects will be for a period of 24 months. **Please be cognizant that any expenditures made prior to the official award notice from PCCD may be deemed ineligible during the application review.**

4. Eligible Applicants:

Per 24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B, eligibility of these funds is open to School Districts, Intermediate Units, Area Career and Technical Schools, Charter Schools, Regional Charter Schools, and Cyber Charter Schools. All eligible applicants and the amount eligible to apply for can be found in Appendix A of this solicitation.

Applicants must be in good standing with PCCD to be eligible for these funds.¹ The applicant and recipient agencies' historical success in implementing PCCD-funded programs/initiatives that met their intended goals will be considered in the review process. Applicants are not required to have a prior funding history with PCCD to be eligible.

5. Eligible Program Activities and Expenses:

Per 24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B, funds can be used to support the following items or activities included in 24 P.S. §13-1306-B(j)(6, 10, 15, 17, 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30), as listed below.

Per Act 33, a school entity is eligible to utilize their mental health grant to meet the [Level 1 Baseline Criteria for Behavioral Health](#) established by the SSSC (see Application Procedures section for more on this standard). If a school entity does NOT meet all Level 1 Baseline Criteria for Behavioral Health, they may only expend funding on other Level 1 eligible items. Once, or if, a school entity has met the Level 1 Baseline Criteria for behavioral health and school climate, they shall be eligible to use funding to support any, all or one of the following:

¹ This may include, but is not limited to, compliance with PCCD program and fiscal reporting requirements, State and Federal funding guidelines, and acceptable risk rating as determined by PCCD.

(j) Specific purposes.--The committee shall provide grants to school entities for programs that address safety and security, including:

6. Risk assessment, safety-related, violence prevention curricula, including dating violence curricula, restorative justice strategies, mental health early intervention, self-care and suicide awareness and prevention curricula.
10. Development and implementation of research-based violence prevention programs that address risk factors to reduce incidents of problem behaviors among students, including, but not limited to, mental health early intervention, self-care, bullying and suicide awareness and prevention.
15. Counseling services for students, including costs associated with the training and compensation of mental health staff or expanding contracts with mental health providers that provide support to students in a school setting.
17. Staff training programs in the use of positive behavior supports, de-escalation techniques, appropriate responses to student behavior that may require immediate intervention and trauma-informed treatment for mental health providers in schools.
19. Costs associated with the training and compensation of certified school counselors, licensed professional counselors, licensed social workers, licensed clinical social workers and school psychologists.
20. Administration of evidence-based screenings for adverse childhood experiences that are proven to be determinants of physical, social and behavioral health and provide trauma-informed counseling services as necessary to students based upon the screening results.
21. Trauma-informed approaches to education², including:
 - i. Increasing student and school employee access to quality trauma support services and behavioral health care, including the following:
 - A. Hiring or contracting with certified school counselors, licensed professional counselors, licensed social workers, licensed clinical social workers, school psychologists and other professional health personnel to provide services to students and school employees.
 - B. Developing collaborative efforts between the school entity and behavioral health professionals to identify students in need of trauma support and to provide prevention, screening, referral and treatment services to students potentially in need of services.
 - C. Partnering with community-based organizations for peer or family support.
 - D. Training on youth-focused mental health first aid for school employees to help recognize signs of mental health distress in students.
 - E. Providing activities to improve mental health in a school entity and after school programming.
 - ii. Programs providing:
 - A. Trauma-informed approaches to education in the curriculum, including training of school employees, school directors and behavioral health professionals to develop safe, stable and nurturing learning environments that prevent and mitigate the effects of trauma.

² Note: Any school entity applying for a grant under 24 P.S. §13-1306-B(j)(21) (i.e., trauma-informed approaches to education) shall utilize a trauma-informed approach plan that meets the criteria established in statute and through a [Model Trauma-Informed Approach Plan](#) adopted by the SSSC on August 28, 2019. Applicants may utilize their own existing plan, provided it meets the SSSC's Model Plan criteria, or may seek funding to support the development of their own plan aligned with this criterion.

- B. Services for children and their families, as appropriate, who have experienced or are at risk of experiencing trauma, including those who are low-income, homeless, involved in the child welfare system or involved in the juvenile justice system.
23. The implementation of [Article XIII-E \(relating to Threat Assessment\)](#).
 24. Expanding telemedicine delivery of school-based mental health services, including equipment.
 25. Providing technical assistance for a school entity related to billing insurance providers in order to better provide mental health services in a school setting.
 26. Creating or expanding statewide programs and intervention frameworks, such as school assistance programs, positive behavioral intervention and supports and multitiered systems of support.
 27. Training and related materials for school employees or students that are evidence-based and focus on identifying the signs and signals of anxiety, depression, suicide or self-harm in students and best practices for seeking appropriate mental health assistance.
 28. Providing, increasing or enhancing partnerships between a school entity and a community-based nonprofit organization, a statewide youth-serving nonprofit or a library for out-of-school programming for at-risk school-age students.
 29. Coordinating and integrating local and county mental health services and programs for school employees or students.
 30. Providing online programs, educational materials and applications to provide supplemental mental health services to students that may include peer support, self-guided evidenced based therapeutic tools and clinical interactions.

All expenses must be described in the Justification box located in the Egrants Budget Detail section. Please note that PCCD has approval of all final budgets. PCCD may also randomly audit and monitor grant recipients to ensure the appropriate use of grant funds and compliance with provisions of the grant program, which includes satisfying Level 1 Baseline Criteria.

6. Ineligible Program Activities and Expenses:

Eligibility of items or activities may be dependent on whether the applicant meets 'Level 1' of the Baseline Criteria Guidance for Behavioral Health developed by the SSSC. Applicants are also limited to selecting appropriate, eligible activities as allowed for by law if they already meet Level 1 criteria.

Any item or activity outside the scope of 24 P.S. §13-1306-B(j)(6, 10, 15, 17, 19, 20, 21, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30) may be deemed ineligible. The SSSC has also previously determined that retractable safety batons for classroom staff, "Framework for Understanding Poverty" book and workbooks, tactical handcuffs and nylon restraints, and school safety hotlines are ineligible expenses.

7. Required Egrants Sections/Documents:

- a. Required Egrants Sections – All sections identified in Egrants are required. Applicants will not be able to submit their grant application in Egrants until all sections are marked as complete.
- b. Required Signed Documents – A successful application must be accompanied by the following:
 - The executed Signature Page (page 2 of the application) - see Submission Information section on page 12 of this document.

8. Application Procedures:

Applicants must submit the requested information for each section specified below within the defined response fields provided in Egrants. Responses should not be duplicated in multiple sections.

a. Executive Summary

All applicants should fill out the following script and paste into the executive summary section:

The name of applicant is requesting \$_____ to [provide a single sentence or two of what you are seeking to implement with your grant funding].

These funds will be used for the following **mental health support enhancements**: [provide bullet points of what the funds will be used for].

Please note that responses in this section may be used in SSSC grant summaries or be posted publicly. Plain language that clearly describes the intent of the project is most effective. **NOTE:** Per the Right-to-Know Law and 24 P.S. §13-1306-B(g.3), PCCD will redact any information submitted by school entities as part of the grant application the disclosure of which would be reasonably likely to result in a substantial and demonstrable risk of physical harm or the personal security of students or staff.

b. Behavioral Health and School Climate Baseline Criteria – Level 1

Per 24 P.S. §13-1315.1-B, school entities are eligible for school mental health grants to meet [Level 1 Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria](#) for Behavioral Health established by the School Safety and Security Committee. *A school entity that has already met the Level 1 Baseline Criteria shall be eligible to expend funds on any eligible mental health activities allowed under this solicitation (see Eligible Program Activities and Expenses).*

Under this section, school entities will be asked to certify if their entity meets Level 1 Baseline Criteria (listed in next paragraph below). Please note that per the PA Public School Code, PCCD staff have the authority to randomly audit and monitor grant recipients to ensure the appropriate use of grant funds and compliance with provisions of the grant program, which includes verifying and satisfying Level 1 Criteria. School entities that falsify information in this section may be subject to returning grant funding or other penalties allowed for by law.

School entities are **strongly encouraged** to carefully review the [Revised Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria standards](#) document and utilize available resources, including an interactive Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria Self-Assessment Checklist Tool prior to completing their application.

School entities not meeting one or more of the Level 1 Behavioral Health and School Climate Baseline Criteria below will be asked clarifying questions about each standard:

- A Student Assistance and Behavioral Health Support Assessment (aligned with [standards and guidance](#) adopted by the SSSC) has been conducted that is representative of the school entity.
- School entity has a process in place for coordination of services and referrals as part of a Student Assistance Program.
- School entity has met statutory requirements related to the provision of certified school nursing services.³

³ 24 P.S. §14-1402(a.1) requires that every child of school age shall be provided with school nurse services and establishes that the number of students under the care of each school nurse shall not

- School entity has a school counseling program⁴ in place to ensure all students have access to qualified services, when needed.
- School entity has a student services plan in place that includes access to a qualified school psychologist.
- School entity has a student services plan that includes access to qualified social work services.
- School entity conducts a survey that includes or addresses school climate-related questions at least every two years.
- School entity has policies and/or procedures in place that comply with state and federal civil rights requirements to respond to discrimination and promote a safe and supportive learning environment for all.⁵
- School entity has policies and/or procedures in place that address the appropriate student use of technology and social media.
- School entity provides age-appropriate prevention education for students aligned with state and federal requirements (e.g. youth suicide awareness and prevention, opioid misuse prevention, threat assessment, etc.).
- Professional training provided to school entity employees pursuant to state and federal requirements.⁶
- School entity has policies and strategies in place to address incidents of bullying and has made that information available as required.⁷
- Where required by state or federal law, school entity has specialized staff training programs in place in the use of de-escalation techniques, and appropriate responses to student behavior that may require immediate intervention (e.g., training aligned with 22 PA Code Chapter 10 (Safe Schools), Chapter 14 (Special Education Services and Programs), Chapter 711 (Charter School and Cyber Charter School Services and Programs for Children with Disabilities); 24 P.S. §13-§1310-B (relating to school safety and security training), etc.).
- School entity develops a [trauma-informed approach plan](#).
- School entity has established at least one threat assessment team and developed policies and/or procedures for assessing and intervening with students whose behavior may indicate a threat.

***NOTE:** For the purposes of grant funding use, school entities may use funding from this solicitation to address gaps identified as part of a recent [Student Assistance and Behavioral Health Assessment](#) conducted by an individual recognized to perform such assessments on the [PCCD School Safety and Security Assessor Registry](#). This means that if a school entity does not meet all of their Level 1 requirements, but has a valid Assessment conducted by a recognized Assessor, they are eligible to utilize grant funding to meet that identified gap. Assessments conducted by any individual not recognized on the PCCD Assessor Registry will not be allowed.

c. **Program Activities**

This section is a checklist included in the Egrants application process. Applicants will be required to select the eligible activity or activities that directly relate to their application for mental health funding. Applicants should determine which eligible program or expense best fits their project. Once an application is submitted, PCCD will review each project and activity section(s) selected for accuracy. For your convenience, PCCD program staff may adjust the Program Activities section to better reflect the activities you are seeking to fund through your application.

d. **Budget Detail**

School entities shall create a single budget that includes all expenses equaling up to the minimum allocation allowed (see minimum allocation listing in Appendix A). **Budgets cannot exceed the minimum allocation for the school entity and should be limited to the eligible mental health-related activities and items allowed under this solicitation.**

Each line-item requires an explanation in the Budget Detail justification section which is found under each budgetary category (e.g. Personnel, Employee Benefits, Travel (Including Training), etc.). The explanation should provide the reviewer with a clear understanding of each line item in that budgetary category, the purpose of the item, and what is included in the cost. See the [Budget Detail Walkthrough](#) for a full description of how to navigate and fill out this section.

For salary and benefits, the applicant shall provide a clear description of all costs for which grant funds will be utilized. Each benefit must be listed as a separate line item. If budgeting for benefits, please take into consideration the state-issued rebates for FICA and retirement if your school entity participates in this rebate program.

Per the PA Public School Code, grant funds shall be used to supplement and not supplant existing spending on school safety and security. Requested funds should be used to enhance and add to security within each school entity. The following provides examples to assist in determining whether the requested activities are considered supplantation.

Supplantation is NOT:

- Requesting school safety funding in a subsequent year for the same purpose and amount awarded in a previous PCCD school safety grant.
- Requesting items/personnel that are currently funded but not currently included/reoccurring in the school entities budget (e.g. other grant funds, temporary funds, etc.).
- Requesting additional funding to increase the hours of personnel currently part-time or increase program/activity capacity (e.g. adding additional cameras above and beyond what is currently budgeted).

Supplantation is:

- Requesting funding for activities/personnel/items currently included in the school entity's yearly budget.
- Utilizing grant funds to retroactively support expenses already procured (e.g., using grant funds to pay ongoing expenses as part of a previously executed contract or purchase order).

Please note that PCCD has approval of all final budgets. Also, the SSSC may randomly audit and monitor grant recipients to ensure the appropriate use of grant funds and compliance with provisions of the grant program, which includes satisfying Level 1 Behavioral Health Baseline Criteria.

9. Performance Measures:

Under this funding announcement, successful applicants are required to comply with all reporting, data collection and evaluation requirements, as prescribed by PCCD and federal or state guidelines.

10. Competitive Bidding/Sole Source Procurement:

All procurement transactions shall be conducted in a manner that provides open and free competition. Grant recipients must follow federal procurement guidelines as identified in 2 CFR 200.320 and in the Procurement Standards section of PCCD's [Applicant's Manual](#).

Procurements by noncompetitive proposal are strongly discouraged and must demonstrate an economic benefit or lack of alternate resources to be justified. If a request is made, the prospective applicant must identify the request as a procurement by noncompetitive proposal and provide a substantial justification for the request within their funding request (See PCCD's [Applicant's Manual](#) for Procurement by Noncompetitive Proposal Approval Procedure).

Please note that using a cooperative purchasing mechanism does not, itself, comply with bid requirements. It is the responsibility of the school entity to retrieve the minimum number of quotes or solicited bids required. Documentation must be maintained and made available upon request to support compliance.

11. Administrative Requirements:

a. Egrants Agency and User Registration:

Prior to submitting a grant application, both the applicant agency and at least two users from the applicant agency must be registered in Egrants. Applicants are strongly advised to allow adequate time to work on application documents in Egrants prior to the submission deadline. Please go to the [Registering in Egrants](#) page on PCCD's website for further information.

b. Fiscal Accountability:

See the [Fiscal Accountability](#) page on PCCD's website for further information.

c. Time and Effort Reporting:

See the [Time and Effort Reports](#) page on PCCD's website for further information.

d. Grant Payments:

- Payments will not be released until all applicable special conditions on the grant award have been satisfied.
- All grantees are required, at a minimum, to submit quarterly fiscal reports. PCCD will only make payments to reimburse actual expenditures reported on the fiscal reports. An agency experiencing cash flow problems may submit fiscal reports monthly and PCCD will reimburse reported expenditures. Non-submission or late submission of the required reports will result in payment delays.
- ACH Payments:
 - All payments to grant recipients will be made through ACH.
 - Either before or at the time an application is submitted to PCCD, the applicant agency must [register as a Non-Procurement Vendor](#) with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

- e. Federal Transparency Act Certification:
This section is required for both state and federal funding streams. See the [Federal Application Requirements](#) page on PCCD's website for further information.
- f. Reporting Requirements:
 - Programmatic reports are due quarterly.
 - Fiscal reports are due quarterly.
 - Late submission of programmatic and fiscal reports may delay payments.
 - All reports must be submitted through the Egrants system.
