

PROBATION AND RECIDIVISM IN PENNSYLVANIA

BASELINING COUNTY RECIDIVISM RATES AMONG OFFENDERS SENTENCED TO PROBATION

ABOUT THE STUDY and its importance

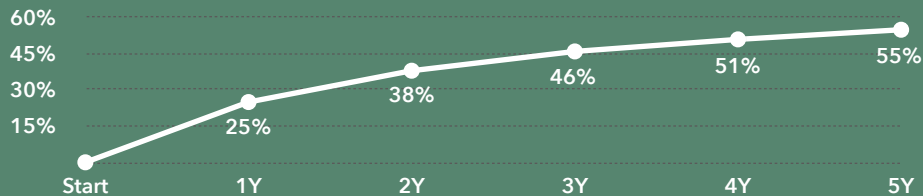
As part of a federal grant award* from the U.S. Department of Justice’s (DOJ) Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS), we studied 40,189 offenders sentenced to Probation (as the most serious sentence) in 2016 across all of Pennsylvania’s 67 counties. This study is part of the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency’s (PCCD) first-phase efforts to baseline county-supervision recidivism, and offenders with a “straight-to-Probation” sentence represent a key county-supervision subpopulation. Other subpopulations include Parole, Intermediate Punishment (IP), and Accelerated Rehabilitative Disposition (ARD). We anticipate baselining the recidivism rates of these subpopulations in the future as PCCD builds toward establishing a statewide county supervision recidivism rate.

In this study, we collected court records across every county in the state and found 40,189 unique offenders that received Probation as their most serious sentence in 2016. In 2022, we gathered and analyzed state criminal history records and calculated recidivism following each offender’s sentence date to Probation. We defined recidivism as the **first instance of rearrest for any new criminal charge, regardless of grade (e.g. Summary, Misdemeanor, or Felony), following an offender receiving a Probation sentence.** Recidivism was measured up to five years following an offender’s sentence date. It is worth mentioning the importance of this report. To the knowledge of the researchers, this study represents the first instance of measuring recidivism in Pennsylvania, both statewide, and within each county, among this sizable offender subpopulation, and over the longer 5-year timeframe. In that regard, the rates herein have great meaning because it is likely the first time many counties are viewing their recidivism rates for this subpopulation.

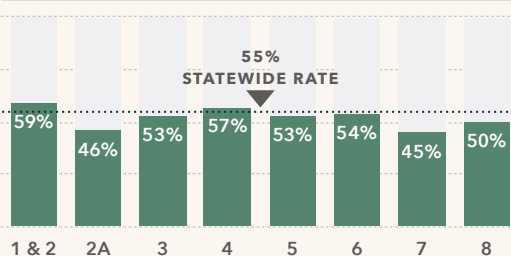
RECIDIVISM RATES BY EXPOSURE TIMEFRAME



REARREST RATES findings overview

Overall, 55% of 40,189 offenders that received Probation as the most serious sentence in 2016, were rearrested within 5 years of their sentence date.

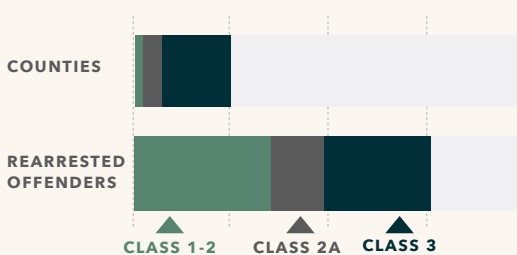
Average 5Y Rearrest, By County Class



In analyzing rearrest rates by the average county within a particular county class, we find that the average Class 1-2 (59%) and Class 4 (57%) counties have slightly higher rearrest rates than the 55% statewide rate. The average Class 3, 5, 6, and 8 counties all have rates below the statewide rate, but they are all within a range (50%-54%) near the statewide rate. The average Class 2A (46%) and Class 7 (45%) counties have the lowest recidivism rates of all county classes.

The five most populated counties in Class 1, 2, and 2A accounted for nearly half (49%) of all rearrested offenders. When we add-in the 12 Class 3 counties, we find that 17 of 67 counties accounted for 76% of all rearrested offenders. Put another way, a quarter of all Pennsylvania counties accounted for three-quarters of all rearrested offenders.
