

## **Trauma-Informed Approach Policy Checklist**

Does our board policy or procedure on trauma-informed approach address: ☐ Definitions of "trauma" and "trauma-informed approach" in accordance with PA School Code. ☐ Designation of an individual (or team) to oversee the school entity's trauma-informed approach plan (for example, the Superintendent, Executive Director, School Safety & Security Coordinator, Director of Student Services, Instructional Support Team, etc.). Direction to applicable staff to seek out and apply for available grant funding related to traumainformed approach. ☐ Training requirements for: Board members/Trustees. All staff and designated staff requiring additional training on student supports. School security personnel (including SROs and contracted personnel). Volunteers, parents/families, community members who are interested. ☐ Screening initiatives, including how results and referrals will be handled. ☐ Services to be provided by the school entity or coordinated with the school, family and countybased services, community organizations, public health entities, nonprofit service providers, before- or after-school care providers or other community groups. ☐ Integration of trauma-informed approach with other school-wide frameworks such as multitiered systems of support (MTSS) or positive behavioral interventions and support (PBIS). Coordination between appropriate school staff members and teams, and recordkeeping considerations. ☐ Parental notification, communication and consent when necessary. Development of partnerships or a Memorandum of Understanding with outside community providers. ☐ Age-appropriate instruction for students on trauma-informed topics and social-emotional

learning as part of the school entity's approved curriculum.

	Staff wellness and supports, including addressing the impact of trauma and secondary trauma on school employees.
	Data collection and review in order to assess trauma-informed approach plans and initiatives.
Other Policies and Procedures to Review and Update for Trauma-Informed Approach Practices:	
	Student attendance policy and practices – focus on school attendance improvement.
	Student Code of Conduct and student disciplinary policies and procedures – incorporation of restorative practices.
	Curriculum and planned instruction – incorporation of age-appropriate instruction and social-emotional learning.
	Student services policies, plan and programs.
	Maintaining appropriate adult/student boundaries and supportive relationships between adults and students in the school community.
	School safety and security policies and procedures, and positive relationships with local law enforcement.
	Threat assessment policy and practices.
	Review of annual budget and fiscal resources to support training and programs.
	Facilities planning to address environments that are attentive to the needs of students and staff.
