



Benefits of relationship between local law enforcement & THE
COMMUNITY

BENEFITS: EARLY IDENTIFICATION & DIVERSION

- Crisis Intervention as a conduit to local law enforcement: Diverting from prison, when appropriate
- Collaboration with CIT Certified Officers and Crisis Intervention
- Early identification: For inclusion in Case Management/Treatment Courts/Special Supervision



MENTAL HEALTH COURT: TEN ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS

- 1. Planning and administration
- 2. Target population
- 3. **Timely participant identification and linkage to services: *Participants are identified, referred, and accepted into mental health courts, and then linked to community-based service providers as quickly as possible.***
- 4. Terms of participation
- 5. Informed choice
- 6. Treatment support and services
- 7. Confidentiality
- 8. Court team
- 9. Monitoring adherence to court requirements
- 10. Sustainability

Judicial System

- **Lancaster County is divided into 19 Magisterial Districts**
- **Lancaster City is covered by 5 of these Judges**
- **Central arraignment was at LCPD from
January 2010 to November 2013**
- **Central arraignment now at Lancaster County Prison**
