

- •Present all information to the District Justice for preliminary arraignment while the arrestee is being held
- •Allows the officer to immediately return to patrolling his community







- Only factor leading to arrest or closure was DNA







- The Facial Recognition technology is only an investigative tool to get you a candidate list.
- JFRS is NOT positive identification.
- JFRS Investigative Search is a tool to be used in conjunction with other investigative methods.














Images are uploaded into the JFRS UI. They can be cropped and adjusted using edit tools that are built into the software.





3D <u>Pose</u> Correction




The integrated pose correction tool allows users to create a 3D model of the face.




3D compare allows users to compare images that may not be face forward.




A link to Data and Images allows users to view all booking images including tattoos as well as all the demographic data entered at the booking center.

Images can sent from a mobile device. The system performs lights out search. An email with a link to the results is sent to the mobile device.









Image from closed circuit video –homicide detective took image of the video screen with iphone and emailed to us. Did a pose correction and ran with basic data filters.


















cNET Records Management System (RMS)

An agency-wide system designed to provide storage, retrieval, retention, manipulation, archiving, and viewing of information, records, documents, or files pertaining to law enforcement operations.

- Provides secure sharing of information in a single agency or among multiple agencies.
- Designed to be accessible and affordable by all agencies
- Implemented +/- 10 years ago by PCPA
- Web-based RMS





System Advantages

- Web-based application-only requirement is Internet browser
- Cost effective
 — No hardware, no capital investment
- No charges for software or maintenance
- One time set-up fee & then annual fee based on number of fulltime sworn officers or equivalent
- Data backup & servers hosted by JNET
- All upgrades & enhancements implemented at the server level and are automatically and immediately available to subscribers





Current System Features

- Enhanced data queries as well as an updated reporting engine
- Integration with CPIN on person and arrest records reduces redundant data entry
- Accepts Criminal complaints data and prints AOPC compliant form
- Inter-agency information sharing at sole discretion of the user agency
- Compliant with CHRIA (Criminal History Record Information Act)
- Integration is available for CAD, UCR, NIBRS, LEJIS, Crime Mapping, and Court Systems
- E-citation & subsequent published dispositions from AOPC





Current System Disadvantages

- Single browser, single platform (PC/Laptop) operation
- Long training curve








cNET 2.0 Upgrade – Dashboard Customization






cNET 2.0 Upgrade - Notifications

cNET 2.0 Upgrade – Advanced (Ad Hoc) Search






In Advanced Searching, users can select categories (referred to as "Pages") or fields to search for information. This gives the users approximately 1800 fields that can be searched.

cNET 2.0 Upgrade – Supervisor View



Within the Supervisor View, a supervisor can view records created or modified by any of their users, assign tasks and priority levels.

cNET 2.0 Upgrade – Graphical Statistics



As a feature of the upgrade, users can view daily, monthly or yearly graphical stats for records created or modified by them. Supervisors can view these stats for any of their agency's users.

What is JNET?

 JNET is the Commonwealth's primary public safety and criminal justice information broker.

 Provides access to 40 applications with information from 19 data providers.

Offers web services and notifications.

JNET Users

JNET serves law enforcement and public safety officials at the federal, state, and local level. Typical users are police, probation officers, courts, 911 and booking centers, district attorneys and domestic relations.

- **1,187** municipal police departments



JNET Access

- Criminal History (CH) This role provides the highest level of access to criminal history records that JNET can provide. Users requesting access to this role must work for a criminal justice agency as defined by the Criminal History Records Information Act (CHRIA) and require access to criminal history records as part of their official duties conducted in the administration of criminal justice.
- Criminal Justice (CJ) Access to all criminal justice information available within JNET, but not criminal history records. May be subject to CHRIA statute provisions and audit requirements. This is the default setting for JNET users who belong to a criminal justice or law enforcement agency before they complete CLEAN certification. Users requesting access to this role must work for a criminal justice agency as defined by the Criminal History Records Information Act (CHRIA).
- Non-Criminal Justice (Non-CJ) Access to all public information available within JNET including, PennDOT photos. Limited access to criminal justice information through AOPC and no access to criminal history records.

WIKILEAKS RELEASES EMAILS FROM THE DEMOCRATIC NATIONAL COMMITTEE. On 07/22/2016, WikiLeaks released 19,252 emails and 8,034 attachments that Democratic National Committee (DNC) officials sent between January 2015 and May 2016. The data was posted on the WikiLeaks Twitter page three days prior to the start of the DNC Convention in Philadelphia. WikiLeaks did not identify the source of the information, but U.S. intelligence agencies have cited the Russian government. The suspected hacker who breached the email system, "Guccifer 2.0," has stated that he is not Russian, but Romanian anti-government hacktivist. Guccifer 2.0 are a Russian language virtual private network (VPN) when he spoke with journalists and often references a prominent Soviet revolutionary member, Felix Dzerzbinsky, in his blog. It is unknown if Guccifer 2.0 is the true hacker of the DNC emails. The Russian government denied any involvement and denied sponsoring Guccifer 2.0. The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is investigating the breach.²

ANALYST COMMENT: The hacker Guccifer 2.0 has modeled himself after a Romanian hacker, Marcel Lazer Lehel, who used the moniker, "Guccifer." In 2013, Lehel was accused of hacking accounts and websites associated with U.S. officials, celebrities, and law enforcement members. Some of his victims included Colin Powell, Barbara Bush, Jim Nantz, and several FBI and Secret service agents. Lehel claimed that he hacked Hillary Clinton's e-mail server while she was serving as U.S. Secretary of State. In 2014, Lehel was indicted by a grand jury and charged with wire fraud, unauthorized access to protected computers, identity theft, cyberstalking, and obstruction of justice. Lehel was extradited to the U.S. and made his first court appearance in April 2016.³

U.S. CONGRESS WEBSITE SHUT DOWN BY DDOS ATTACK. The U.S. Congress' website was shut down for three days after its online portal congress.gov and the U.S. Library of Congress and the U.S. Copyright Office were affected by a distributed denial of service (DDoS) attack. The U.S. Library of Congress

spokesperson claimed that the event stemmed from a domain name system (DNS) attack that started on 07/17/2016. A hacker created malformed user datagram protocol (UDP) packets and sent them to the DNS server. As a result,

About PFAD

In October 1994, Governor Robert Casey signed into law Act 85, a bill providing extensive amendments to Pennsylvania's Protection From Abuse Act, which included the legislative mandate for a statewide protection order registry, operated by the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP).

In May 1996, PCADV submitted to the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD), a concept paper and preliminary budget for a 3-year project to establish a Pennsylvania PFA Database. The information contained in those documents was subsequently included in PCCD's application for National Criminal History Improvement Program funding for Fiscal Year 1996. That funding was granted and the Protection From Abuse Database Project began in February 1997.

Since that time, PCADV has developed and implemented PFAD, an electronic statewide database. PFAD's mission is to establish and maintain a database that includes all PFA proceedings in the Commonwealth. It is a computer archival system designed to complement the operation of the Pennsylvania State Police Protection Order Registry.

This archival database automates the PFA process in the courts; provides critical statewide data for analysis by the courts and law enforcement; creates and disseminates the PSP Protection From Abuse Summary Data Sheet - information necessary for inclusion in the PSP Registry; and contains all standardized PFA forms approved by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court as well as other forms necessary for protection from abuse cases. PFAD is currently working on developing and implementing electronic forms for Indirect Criminal Contempts. Records from PFAD are immediately available 24 hours a day/365 days a year to authorized users (includes courts, legal agencies and the private bar) via a SECURED Internet website.

Due to PFAD's experience in developing this web-based database, other states have requested technical assistance as they begin to launch their own databases.

This Order is entered after a hearing and decision by the court. Without regard as to how the order was entered, this is a final order of court subject to full enforcement pursuant to the Protection From Abuse Act.

Plaintiff's request for a final protection order is granted.

- 1. Defendant shall not abuse, stalk, harass, threaten or attempt to use physical force that would reasonably be expected to cause bodily injury to Plaintiff or any other protected person in any place where they might be found.
- 2. Defendant is completely evicted and excluded from the residence at:

or any other residence where Plaintiff or any other person protected under this order may live. Exclusive possession of the residence is granted to Plaintiff. Defendant shall have no right or privilege to enter or be present on the premises of Plaintiff or any other person protected under this order.

- 3. Defendant is prohibited from having ANY CONTACT with Plaintiff, or any other person protected under this order either directly or indirectly, at any location, including but not limited to any contact at Plaintiff's or other protected party's school, business, or place of employment.
- 4. Defendant shall not contact Plaintiff, either directly or indirectly, or any other person protected under this order, by telephone or by any other means, including through third persons.
- 5. FIREARMS, OTHER WEAPONS AND AMMUNITION RESTRICTIONS

Defendant is prohibited from possessing, transferring or acquiring any firearms for the duration of this order.

Defendant is directed to relinquish the the sheriff any firearm, other weapon or ammunition listed in Attachment A to Final Order, which is incorporated herein by reference.

- 6. Any firearm delivered to the sheriff or transferred to a licensed firearm dealer, or a qualified third party who satisfies the procedural and substantive requirements to obtain a safekeeping permit issued under 23 Pa. C.S.A. § 6108.3 pursuant to this order or the temporary order shall not be returned to Defendant until further order of court or as otherwise provided by law.
- 7. The following additional relief is granted as authorized by §6108 of the Act:

Defendant is prohibited from stalking, as defined in 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 2709.1, or harassing, as defined in 18 Pa.C.S.A. § 2709, the following family and household members of Plaintiff:





What is SAVIN?

Statewide Automated Victim Information Notification (SAVIN)

- A free service that lets you register for notification when an offender is released, transferred or escapes from a county or state prison.
- Notification can occur either by telephone, e-mail and/or text.





How Does SAVIN Work?

- APPRISS, located in Louisville, KY, is the vendor that provides the SAVIN service in Pennsylvania.
- Offender custody information is stored at the Communications Center in Louisville, KY.
- County Prisons send data every 15 minutes, 24 hours a day,
 7 days a week.
- Entries into the Jail Management System will be sent to Appriss. These trigger the notifications to the registrants.



Types of Notifications

- Release, Escape, Appeal, Bail
- Unsupervised Custody, Work Release, Alternative Housing, Furlough
- Transfers
- Death
- Return to Custody: Violation of Probation, Work Release, Return Medical, Return Escape



SAVIN & Law Enforcement

- SAVIN is a tool for Law Enforcement as first-responders.
- Officers provide the victim with information on registering for PA SAVIN.
- In situations where an offender is being held in jail after an arrest, it is important to let the victim know to register within an hour or so of the offender's being taken to jail to allow time for intake to be done, so that notification of release can be made.
 - This is essential because an inmate can make bond within hours of arrest.
- An offender does not have to be sentenced in order for a registration to be done. He or she needs only to be booked into the jail.





SAVIN & Law Enforcement (con't.)


- Police and Probation/Parole Officers can also register to keep track of offenders.
- SAVIN is useful for monitoring gang and offender activity, determining whether or not certain actors are incarcerated, and finding out the location of the prison where the offender is being held.
- Officers can receive notifications if they or their families have been threatened.
- The whereabouts of an offender can be confirmed before attempting to serve a warrant.







Pacrimvictims.com (con't.)

- For offenders who are incarcerated at the state system, victims can click on OVA.
















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












PA SAVIN: Pennsylvania's Victim Notification Service

PA SAVIN is an automated service that lets you track the custody status of offenders in county jails, state prisons, or on state parole. By calling the toll-free number or visiting www.pacrimevictims.com, you can find out the custody status of an offender. You can also register to be notified by phone and e-mail if the custody status of an offender changes.

- Escapes

When PA SAVIN calls, listen to the message, then enter your PIN followed by the pound (#) key when asked. Entering the PIN lets PA SAVIN know that you received the call and will stop the service from calling you again.

- Since PA SAVIN calls automatically when an offender's custody status changes, you may get a call from PA SAVIN in the middle of the night.
- If there is no answer, PA SAVIN will continue calling back until you enter your PIN or until up to 72 hours have passed. If you do not answer a notification call, PA SAVIN will leave a message.
- Do not register a phone number that rings to a switchboard.
- PA SAVIN is confidential. The offender will not know you are registered with PA SAVIN.
- You can register multiple phone numbers and e-mail addresses for notifications.
- If you forget your PIN, call the toll-free number and press zero. You will be transferred to an operator who can help you reset your PIN or cancel notification.
- Operators are available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to assist you.


