# A REPORT ON TRAINING & COURT WORK

#### ABOUT


The Constables' Education and Training Board (CETB) trains and certifies the Commonwealth's constables and deputy constables. Training consists of basic and firearms education, leading to certification to perform judicial duties and receive payment. The Board operates with the oversight and staff support of the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD), and is funded via surcharges assessed to District Judge offices, county courts, and prothonotaries for services rendered by Constables. For the last decade, the Board's annual expenditures have exceeded revenue due to various factors. The Board and PCCD have discussed and extensively researched the collection of the surcharge, which is dependent on the fee being properly assessed and fully collected on court work by constables. The research found a flat to slight decrease in the assessment and collection of the surcharge. PCCD does not control the assessment and collection of the surcharge.

#### **NEWLY CERTIFIED CONSTABLES 2016**


506 newly elected/appointed constables and deputy constables were trained in 2016, the first year of their term of office. Of those trained, 353, or nearly 70%, were certified to work for the courts. None of the newly certified constables performed court work in 2016.

## COURT WORK newly certified constables






PERCENT OF TOTAL DOCKETS: WORKING IN HOME COUNTY VS OUT OF COUNTY







#### KEY FINDINGS

- The number of constables trained to work for the courts declined by 9.2% from 2016 to 2018.
- Of those trained, 44.1% in 2016, 47.4% in 2017, and 49.1% in 2018, did not perform any court work. The data is trending towards an increased
  percentage of constables not performing court work in 2019 and beyond.
- The 2016 constable trainee cohort was analyzed longitudinally to ascertain the 3 year court-work rate of all trainees essentially tracking which constables continued to work for the courts through 2018. In 2016, nearly 56% of trained constables worked for the courts. By 2018, the 821 constables working for the court in 2016 decreased to 641, a reduction of 22%. Only 44% of all 2016 trainees continued to work for the courts in 2018.
- An analysis of 506 newly elected and appointed constables found that 30% (153) of the trainees did not pass training, and therefore were not
  certified. Of the remaining 70% (353) of newly certified constables, no evidence of performing court work was found in 2016, 2017, or 2018.
- 857 unique constables were identified as having performed court work during the three years. While 2,239 constables were trained and performed court work between 2016 to 2018, only 38% were unique constables.
- Of the 857 unique constables performing court work, 3 out of every 4, or 77% (659), worked in the top 10 counties based on the percentage of unique constables working there. The top 10 counties included Allegheny with 28% of all unique constables working there, followed by Dauphin, Montgomery, Chester, Columbia, Lebanon, Centre, Lancaster, Blair, and Berks. While 77% of all unique constables worked in these counties, the counties represented 41% of all executed dockets, suggesting that constable saturation in some of those counties may be occurring.
- Similar to the number of trained constables decreasing, so too did the number of executed dockets from 2016 to 2018. During the three years, dockets decreased by 13.5%. As court work, particularly dockets, yields a surcharge to the CETB to help fund constable education/training, the implication is that a decrease in court work may lead to a decrease in revenue to the CETB.
- During the three years, 10 counties (Allegheny, Montgomery, Delaware, York, Berks, Bucks, Lehigh, Dauphin, Washington, and Chester) accounted for 65% of all dockets. 56 counties accounted for the remaining 35%.
- The vast majority of all dockets (89%) came from constables working in their home county. Only 11% of dockets came from constables working outside of their home county.
- 1,723,658 service assessments were made by constables on 543,430 unique dockets in 2016, for an average of 3.2 service assessments per docket.
- In 2016, 3% of all dockets were criminal, 6% were civil, and the remaining 91% were for other categories, mainly traffic (53.8%), non-traffic (17.8%), and landlord/tenant (18.2%). The conclusion is that statewide, constables are executing civil dockets at twice the rate of criminal dockets, non-traffic or landlord/tenant dockets at three times the rate of civil dockets, and traffic dockets at over three times the rates of either non-traffic or landlord/tenant dockets. From end to end, constables are executing traffic dockets at nearly eighteen times the rate of criminal dockets.

## INSTRUCTIONS for how to interpret the data below

The table below displays county statistics on the reported dockets executed and the number of unique constables working within a county.

**Example interpretation:** 242 unique constables, or 28.2% of all unique constables, worked for the courts within Allegheny County. Collectively, the 242 constables executed 16,890 dockets, or 12.8% of all statewide dockets during the three year period.

# INSTRUCTIONS for how to interpret the data below

The table below displays county statistics on the reported types of dockets (e.g. civil, criminal, etc.) executed by constables. Due to space constraints, the docket types were divided into three categories: criminal, civil, and other. The "other" category comprised the following docket types: landlord/tenant, traffic, non-traffic, miscellaneous, and secure.

**Example interpretation:** In Adams County, 12 criminal dockets, 209 civil dockets, and 3,283 other dockets were executed by constables. Respectively, these accounted for 0.3%, 6.0%, and 93.7% of all of Adams County's executed dockets in 2016.
